

The Private Equity Foundation (PEF) is founded, with Ramez Sousou (Towerbrook) as Chair and Shaks Ghosh as the first CEO.

ThinkForward

PEF founds and incubates **ThinkForward**, a charity offering a breakthrough solutions to dramatically reduce the risk of young people being NEET (out of education, training or employment).



Impetus-PEF

PEF and **Impetus Trust** merge to form **Impetus-PEF**, with **Johannes Huth** (KKR) as Chair of the Board and **Daniela Barone Soares** as CEO, with an 'impact first, then scale' approach and a focus on education and youth employment.

Education Endowment Foundation

The Impetus Trust sets up the **Education Endowment Foundation (EEF)** in 2011 in partnership with the **Sutton Trust**, with a founding grant of £125m from the Department for Education. The **EEF** is the **What Works Centre for Education** and exists to break the link between family income and educational achievement. **The Stone Family Foundation** invests £750,000 over five years.

We set up the Youth Endowment Fund in partnership with Social Investment Business and the Early Intervention Foundation, with a £200m endowment and ten year mandate from the Home Office to prevent children and young people from becoming involved in violence.

In response to the pandemic and its impact on young people, we work with **Youth Futures Foundation, Youth Employment UK**, the **Institute for Employment Studies** and **The Prince's Trust** to form the **Youth Employment Group (YEG)** – which becomes the UK's largest coalition of youth employment experts – to advocate for full and inclusive employment for young people.

Online tutoring pilot

Working with **The Education Endowment Foundation** (EEF), **The Sutton Trust**, and **Nesta**, we launch an online tuition pilot to show that tutoring can reach disadvantaged groups even during school closures, funded by **Fidelity Foundation**, **Hg Foundation**, **Inflexion Foundation**, **Dulverton Trust** and **Porticus**.

This results in the establishment of the **National Tutoring Programme** to help pupils who have fallen behind to catch up, channelling billions of pounds towards tutoring.

Covid hits. We raise emergency covid relief funds from **Livingbridge** and others.

More investment

The Bruno Schroder Trust makes a seven-figure commitment to Impetus and our portfolio for the next three years.





In partnership with Minton Charitable Trust we further invest in Football Beyond Borders and Voice 21 with £600,000 over three years and we launch a partnership with Evelyn for £300,000 over three years.

Youth Hub blueprint

We work with the Department for Work and Pensions and West Midlands Combined Authority to develop a Youth Hub blueprint at the Library of Birmingham.





New office

Impetus moves to its new office on Duncannon Street, central London.

Impetus Leadership Academy

We launch the Impetus Leadership Academy, a leadership development programme to support talent from ethnic minority backgrounds in the UK youth sector.

Engage Fund

We launch the Engage Fund with the Henry Smith Charity, investing in five innovative organisations -Think for the Future, Olive Academies, Transforming Lives for Good, MCR Pathways, The Difference working on high quality interventions tackling school exclusions.

National Tutoring Programme

We publish two reports outlining steps the Department for Education needs to take to improve the effectiveness of the National Tutoring Programme, so that all schools can secure the tutoring they need for their pupils.

Fair university access

We host a speech for John Blake as Director for Fair Access and Participation at the Office for Students. Subsequently we bring together charities working on widening access to university with the Office for Students to share best practice.





Leadership Academy graduation

The inaugural cohort of the **Impetus Leadership Academy** graduates from the programme, with 10 out of 12 participants progressing into more senior roles.



Connect Fund

We launch the Connect Fund with The Centerbridge Foundation, Allan & Gill Gray Philanthropy, The Towerbrook Foundation, Sainsbury's and Bain & Company.

The fund aims to close the employment gap faced by young people from ethnic minority backgrounds in the UK. We invest in Career Ready and MAMA Youth.


